You will be able to access your PDF proof within the next 6 to 8 weeks for approval. The corresponding author will receive an email alert containing a link to a web site. This will enable the file to be opened, read on screen and annotated directly within the PDF. Corrections can also be supplied by hard copy if preferred. Further instructions will be sent with the proof. Once corrected and published online, your article will then be placed into the production queue for allocation to a hard-copy issue. Hard-copy publication normally occurs 6-12 months after acceptance, depending on the current publication lag. Please note that no corrections or changes can be made to the content of the article once published online.

OnlineOpen is available to authors of primary research articles who wish to make their article available to non-subscribers on publication, or whose
